

# Moderator Action Commands

This is a list of the most frequently used moderator action commands. Review with an Admin.

All Commands are to be done in #mod-bot.

## Command: +warn

Description: Warn a member

Cooldown: 3 seconds

Usage:

+warn [user ID] [reason]

Example:

+warn 470724017205149701 Stop posting lewd images

## Examples on when you would use +warn:

1. [User] has been given a Verbal Warning 1x or 2x (amount depending on severity)
2. [User] is piloting an NSFW conversation
3. [User] asks where to get substances, "where can I get "x"

## Command: +mute

Description: Mute a member so they cannot type.

Cooldown: 3 seconds

Usage:

+mute [user ID] [limit] [reason]

Example:

+mute 470724017205149701 10m Shitposting

+mute 470724017205149701 5h He asked for it

## Examples on when you would use +mute:

Being hostile/arguing/toxicity after +warn (30m/1h first mute , 3h second mute, 6h third mute)

[User] is shitposting/using unrelated conversation in #serious-talk

[User] is circumventing slurs or dark-web related terms (ie. oniun, d-web, etc.)

### **Command: +kick**

Description: Kick a member.

Cooldown: 3 seconds

Usage:

+kick [user id] [reason]

Example:

+kick 470724017205149701 Get out!

## Examples on when you should use +kick:

User using derogatory pronoun fillers (Trans/Racial, Nick/Gu\*\*, etc.) after told to change

### **Command: +ban**

(Only usable by Confirmed Moderators, Trial Moderators do not have permission to ban)

Description: Ban a member, optional time limit

Cooldown: 3 seconds

Usage:

+ban [user id] [limit] [reason]

Example:

+ban 470724017205149701 2d Sourcing

## Examples on when to use +ban

[User] commits blatant sourcing/giving out sources to substance-related websites or making it easier to obtain.

Hate-speech towards users to an extreme (ie. Directed towards user, actioned multiple times)

[User] spreads misinformation/private information about another user (note: This MUST go through ModMail or an Admin to confirm the action, heavy topics are usually handled by experienced Moderators such as Senior Moderators/Admins)

## Command: +note

Description: Add note(s) about a member

Cooldown: 3 seconds

Usage: +note [user id] [note here]

Example:

+note 470724017205149701 Fantastic dude!

### Examples on when to use +note:

[User] is suspected to be underage, please @ an admin if you leave a note so they can review it properly.

[User] has a past of being very opinionated or a traumatic event has happened that has been spoken to with the Mods/Admin Team, the note will be used to assess severity of actions.

## Command: +notes

Description: Get notes for a user

Cooldown: 10 seconds

Usage:

+notes [user id]

Example:

+notes 470724017205149701

### Examples of when to use +notes:

Used by Admins/Moderators to check notes on a specific user, self explanatory.

## Command: +modlog

Description: Get a list of mod actions used on a user and notes

Cooldown: unknown

Usage:

+modlog [user id]

Example:

+modlog 470724017205149701

### Examples of when to use +modlogs:

[User] has broken a rule, used to check past moderation actions.

ALWAYS check the modlogs before actioning a user, this explains past offenses and will determine the future offenses of a user and will be checked by all Moderators.

## **Command: +unmute**

Description: Unmute member

Usage:

+unmute [userid] [reason]

Example:

+unmute 666975697490673664 made a mistake

### Examples of when to use +unmute:

[User] was muted by accident/staff made a mistake trying to mute another [User]

Mute was determined to be unwarranted by other staff members.

DO NOT unmute a [User] that was muted by another staff member without reviewing it with a higher-up staff member.

## **Command: +reason**

Description: change modlog reason

Usage:

+reason [case # from #dyno-log]

Example:

+reason 162 muted for nsfw gif

### **Examples on when to use +reason:**

Spelling/Correction mistake in initial reasoning for any type of command made towards a [User]
